Cllr Waltham responded

• Thank you also to all the volunteers and that NLC had invested more than £100k on litter picking equipment to help the volunteers. He also stressed that it very important to use the equipment once it has been issued to an individual.

Enforcement against littering, especially litter and cigarette ends being thrown from cars has been increased with active cases being pursued.

TIC is open and providing a slightly different service. It cannot provide literature due to covid restrictions, but provision is being made for online resource in the library. The small business advice service is being enriched and the provision is customer service and technology based.

21/032 Electoral Boundary Review update

<u>Cllr Waltham updated</u> on the NLC electoral review, advising that it had been 26 years since the last one and that a consultation is planned for end of July. The Parliamentary Review is at the first stage of the consultation and is designed to equalise parliamentary / constituents. It is likely that Brigg and Goole will no longer be a seat and it will be amalgamated with other seats to make a new one. South Humber has been suggested for the seat.

It was resolved to comment that South Humber is an inappropriate name for the seat and that Brigg and Northern LincoInshire is more appropriate for the area.

Cllr Waltham to arrange for the collection of the poppy cascade and will scope with North Lindsey College.
- g) Grass cutting in Brigg was discussed and it was agreed it has been a very difficult year due to 19 days of solid rain in May but do acknowledge the contractor's flexibility. Clerk to request that the PROW cutting commences 3 weeks earlier next year.
